



Raley's Gets A Makeover

The Raley's on Freeport Boulevard has really stepped things up. They have repainted the entire front of the building and spiffied up the classic neon Raley's sign. They have an all new interior; the outdated orange has been replaced with modern brown. "Farm To Fork For You" signs made of dark wood and more tract lighting to set a mood. I also noticed more lighting in the liquor aisle...easier to see the Fireball Whisky! The employees are also using headphones and mics to communicate...no more "Cleanup in aisle 5" over the loudspeaker.

Raley's has also been playing hipper tunes over the speaker system, too. I actually heard Prince! I even saw a dad doing some air guitar near the Doritos. Raley's has also finally caved to the craft beer revolution and is now offering Track 7's finest Pale Ale. They labeled it "A Bomber Sale" right up front when I walked into the supermarket.

Another local business getting a makeover is the **Jade Fountain Café** in the little strip mall on Freeport.

The Jade Fountain Café has been closed for remodeling since March. There have been quite a few hungry diners dropping by only to find a sign saying, "Closed for remodeling". The management also thanked their valuable customers for their patronage over the years. There is a slew of Chinese restaurants in the little strip mall, but Jade Fountain Café seems to be a local favorite. Folks love the porridge!

There has been an old storage pod in front of the restaurant since the middle of March with no activity, until recently. When I dropped by the family owned restaurant the jovial owner, Randy Lee, told me they were making some upgrades to the place. Keeping some old, adding some new. Lee told me they'll have more comfortable seating for diners, they're opening up the kitchen area, and making the restaurant brighter with new paint and interior.

Lee added, "It's gonna look nice!"

He also told me they're replacing the worn, faded, sign in front of the restaurant. Look for the grand re-opening at the end of August.

A lot of Hollywood Park neighbors are wondering, "When is **Fountainhead Brewing Company** opening?"

Daniel Moffat, one of the owners/brewmaster, was asked that question at the last Hollywood Park General Meeting and he mentioned late July. We are now in August and TS Auto still has some cars on the property and there doesn't seem to be much construction or cleanup going on. I sent a message to Daniel and he said, "We're hesitant to spec-

ify a date at this point. We are in progress with the City but it will take some time. Meanwhile, we have prepped our brewing/fermenting space and are ready to take shipment of our equipment." Fountainhead still needs to get inspected and approved by the City.

As soon as that happens, they'll start brewing and have a better timeline to share as far as when the brewery will open. They don't expect it to be more than a couple months but they don't want to put a date on it yet. Daniel added, "We can't wait to get the beer flowing!"





















Hollywood Park Neighborhood Survey

Mangan Pool Makes a Comeback in 2014 Summer Heat

On a sweltering Friday afternoon in late July, Hollywood Park's neighborhood swimming pool, Mangan Pool, was buzzing with activity. Kids of all ages were enjoying a welcome respite from the summer furnace of Sacramento at this city operated public pool just south of Fruitridge Road at 34th Avenue and Dana Way. The namesake of the pool, James Mangan, a former city lifeguard and playground supervisor who became superintendent of the city recreation department and was dubbed in 1941 by the Sacramento Bee to be a "pal to 5,000 youngsters," would have been incredibly proud. Especially considering that a mere two years ago, Mangan's cool waters were closed due to city budget constraints.

Last year, thanks to the Measure U sales tax increase and the efforts of our own District 5 councilman, the recently re-elected Vice Mayor Jay Schenirer, Mangan was able to be kept open for three days per week. This summer, those same efforts have been able to ensure that neighborhood children and families can swim six days a week from Monday through Saturday. On top of that, the city offered free swimming lessons at Mangan this summer, of which every session was filled to capacity.

Coming out of this turbulent period, the city had fairly low expectations for the summer of 2014. All of which were proved wrong. Karly Hammack, Manager of Mangan Pool



was told at the beginning of the summer not to expect more than five people at the pool per day. Hammack is happy to report that although Mangan was not one of the busiest pools city, she made big efforts to "be attentive to the needs and desires of the community of loyal regulars" and through word of mouth, the somewhat isolated pool was able to dispel all expectations to the contrary and once again become a cornerstone of the community.

Mangan Pool is now closed as of August 23rd, but expect similar or even expanded programs next year--anyone interested in a swimming team? The pool costs just \$2 per child age 17 and under and \$4 for adults, features a diving board and is handicapped accessible. Along with swimming lessons, the pool offers water aerobics classes and a junior lifeguard program.

Hollywood Park Neighbors: Help Feed Zoo Animals!

Hello! This is your resident Zoo-Keeper, Lindsey, who lives right here in Hollywood Park. Sacramento Zoo has recently reached out to the community to get the word out about our "Browse Program". Basically, Browse is nontoxic vegetation, such as leafy branches, eaten by animals. Browse is fed daily to the exotic animals at the zoo- along with their prescribed zoo diets.

"Which animals?" you ask: Species such as giraffes, chimps, antelope, lemurs, and kangaroos!

"How can I help?" You can donate your tree and shrub trim-

mings! Save time and energy by donating your vegetation instead of cutting and cramming it into your yard bin. Many trees and shrubs, such as Ash, Mulberry, Camelia, Citrus, Photinia, and Magnolia are all edible!
