Design Chosen For Neighborhood Sign Sculpture

A casey Marshall of Fabritype Maker Co. (fabritype.com) presented three designs for the Hollywood Park Neighborhood Sign which were voted on by the HPNA membership during the September 16 General Meeting. The sign project generated a lively discussion during the general meeting, with a few members suggesting the vote be postponed to a later general meeting or conducted online and others expressing doubts about the three designs. In the end, the membership in attendance agreed to hold a vote during the general meeting with an option for a write-in vote for "none of the above". 71 percent of the votes were in favor of one of the three designs. With whimsical sculptural

elements, the sign design dubbed "Front Yard" garnered the most votes and will surely become a neighborhood landmark.

On October 26, the HPNA Sign Committee held an Open House for the sign project to present the winning design, discuss the history of the project, and discuss the steps necessary to make the project a reality. (Continued on back cover)

So long To Spencer's Frameworks

Tis the holiday season and for Terry Spencer, owner of Spencer's Frameworks on Freeport Blvd, it's a special one. This year will be her last as owner of the frame shop that has been a fixture on Freeport Boulevard for 30 years. "It's time to hang up the apron and put the hammer down". She said.

Terry boasted that she's "enjoyed the most incredible and rewarding career" at Spencer's Frameworks and added, "If I was 30 years younger, I'd do it all over again".

Good Eats Inside The Swiss Buda

One thing that really excites me is good old fashioned comfort food. I'm a chicken and ribs kind of guy. So when I heard "Good Eats Southern BBQ" was taking over the kitchen inside the Swiss Buda on Fruitridge Boulevard my taste buds started to tingle.

Locals in South Land Park and beyond flocked to Good Eats when it was inside the Vic's IGA in South Land Park. When Vic's IGA closed without warning Eric McFadden and Good Eats were left out in the cold.

Good Eats Southern BBQ is now located in the warm confines of the iconic Swiss Buda Lounge. Ribs, fried chicken, tri-tip,

poor boy sandwiches with tasty sides like mac-n-cheese, fries, or potato salad are just some of the items on the menu for dinner. Eric let me sample the rib plate and I was in hog heaven. It was moist and delicious. I needed a wet-nap...stat!

The Swiss Buda will also offer traditional breakfast on Saturday and Sunday. Eggs Benedict, corned beef hash, and of course loco moco, which consists of white rice, topped with a hamburger patty, a fried egg, and brown gravy. It's a Hawaiian thing!

Bull Ah Yun, the owner of the Swiss Buda told me, "after my dad passed I tried to get the kitchen going again.

Come Join 3rd Annual Hollywood Park Citrus Harvest!

Have a tree that needs harvesting? Love to harvest fruit? Interested in meeting neighbors and helping others in need?

Saturday, 20 February 2016, 9am-1pm Centennial United Methodist Church 5401 Freeport Boulevard, Sacramento, California 95822

Volunteers will be placed into groups of 5-10 people with a trained harvest group leader. Each group will receive a list of 3-5 tree sites to harvest, and will be provided with all necessary harvesting materials, including gloves, picker-poles, ladders, clippers and boxes (however, if you have your own, please do bring them!!).

Volunteers will carpool (or walk) to each site and ideally be able to transport tools and harvested fruit between sites and then back to Centennial United Methodist Church. It is extremely helpful if each group has a pick-up truck or van to help transport materials and fruit. If you have this type of vehicle and are willing to bring it, we would be grateful!!

After the harvest, large bins are placed at Centennial United Methodist Church and citrus is shared with the neighborhood and those volunteering to help – all left-over citrus is donated to local food banks. At the Harvest Hollywood Park 2015 Citrus Harvest, over 3000 pounds of fruit was harvested. Yes, 3000 pounds with 2000 pounds donated to local food banks.

We will be serving a simple lunch after the harvest to create an opportunity for participants to meet volunteers from other harvest groups, share their experiences together over a good meal and meet the Hollywood park community.


Design Chosen For Neighborhood Sign Sculpture

The Sign Committee, Casey Marshall, and County Supervisor Patrick Kennedy spoke about the sign project and answered questions. Topics discussed included the design concept, the physical dimensions and layout of the project, the funding sources, and the fundraising needed to raise approximately \$7,000 to match grants received from the City and County. Overall, the Open House was a positive and constructive event, with neighbors excited and curious to see the final project through and even to help with fundraising efforts.

If you were on Nextdoor Hollywood Park or checked out HPNA's Facebook page, you may have seen the discussions over the sign project developed soon after the Open House. A neighbor requested we address some questions they had about the process at the next HPNA Board Meeting. About 20 neighbors attended the Board meeting and the face-to-face discussion between neighbors and the HPNA Board was constructive. The submitted questions and the Board's responses are available on the HPNA website.

Next steps for the sign project are to formally sign an agreement with Casey Marshall and kick-off fundraising efforts. Up-to-date information about the Sign Project is available on the HPNA website at Hollywoodpark95822.org.
