Springtime in beautiful Hollywood Park... I love it!

There are so many green thumbs in this neighborhood. The variety of blooming trees and flowers seems to get better every year. It's hard to believe that most

of the area once had little more than the personality of the newer neighborhoods on the edges of town. You know, the kind of streets where every third or fourth home look alike and the land is almost barren. There are some exceptions though, like the roads that lead closest to Leonardo da Vinci School. These were built approximately 15 years before the rest of the area and in Carleton Tract, where a few homes were built before the turn of the century or soon after.

So as the neighborhood physically matures with the majority of homes a little over 60 years old, the dynamic change of it's residents has as well. I interviewed an original owner back in 2005 for this publication. She told me that there used to be many more families with children in the 1950's & 60's. Life was "simpler" and more neighbors talked over the old grape stake fences. People would gather more often for events which were announced by word of mouth.

Has it changed much? There may be less children, many homes have additions, the landscape is more mature, and most fences have been updated so you can't see your neighbors. But we still have some great gatherings and I'm pleased to tell you there will be a few more this year.

The HPNA Board is in the stages of planning an outdoor movie night, a special day to support a struggling local business, and promoting all to participate on National Night Out. Last year there wasn't enough support to have a HPNA River Cats night, but maybe it'll work out this summer.

# **Goodwill Xpress Opens in Hollywood Park**

Many of you may have already noticed- the former KFC restaurant on the corner of Freeport Blvd. and Meer Way is now a Goodwill Donation Xpress center. Beyond the change of the signage in front of the former KFC, many of you may have also noticed the large Goodwill trailer alongside the building (I know I did). I called Goodwill Industries of Sacramento to find out what is going on.

I spoke with Dinorah Curkendall, of Goodwill Sacramento, to get the scoop on what the plans were for the location, as well as to have a few concerns of my own addressed. Ms. Curkendall informed me right away that the trailer is temporary and will be removed once the interior space of the former KFC is renovated (I wasn't the first person to call and ask it seems!).

The official opening date of the permanent Hollywood Park location of the Goodwill Donation Xpress center has not been determined yet, as permits for renovation of the building and premises are still pending. Ms. Curkendall said that once the permits are approved, the work should proceed very rapidly. Her estimate is that the building should be ready in late May or June.

Improvements described by Ms. Curkedall include interior renovation, landscaping, lighting and a video surveillance system. Once complete, the trailer will be removed.

Another concern I had is off-hours dumping on the property. On a recent Friday evening, I noticed a pile of various household items next to the trailer. The next morning the mess was gone, but it raised concern in me that this may be a regular occurrence. Ms. Curkendall addressed my concerns, stating that they are regularly checking on the location during non-business hours for any illegal dumping. She mentioned that once renovations are complete, a video surveillance system will monitor and act as a deterrent to illegal dumping.

# Garden Light

Now is the time to give the front gardens a shot of color and a new look. Think about adding instant color with annuals or perennials in large pots. The nurseries have choices galore, although it takes a little effort to find unique plants. One of the pleasures of our neighborhood is its "walkability". And, when we think of our gardens and adding curb appeal, we have options close at hand.

Clean up the lawn, and consider adding shade plants where the lawn is thinning as trees grow and cast shadows. I have grown to love my adjustable hose end bottle sprayers. It is so easy to add fish emulsion or other natural nutrients to the garden to help it perk up in the summer. And when we must resort to a spray to contain pesty invasive growth, the sprayer can be adjusted to deliver just the right amount. Do you have Nutsedge or Bermuda grass invading your lawn? Our own Capitol Nursery carries lawn sprays that will not kill your lawn while tackling these hard to eradicate pests, along with beautiful and unique blooming

Need large garden pots or other decorative objects to add that instant "pow"? Close by Panama Pottery meets the need – and can even match the "vintage" of your home with their wares. Also, great unique garden objects can be found at our neighborhood merchants, Hollywood Hardware and Collected Works. They both have items that could make cheery new front door decorations, too.

Add a little cleanup – tuck away those spent spring bulbs by hiding the dying foliage under surrounding plants or holding down with a small rock. Don't cut it off! The foliage gives the bulb nutrients for next year's flowers. Don't let the weeds go to seed! The seeds can stay viable in the soil for years, so a little effort now saves much effort later. And if you saved those fall leaves, run the lawn mower over the small crinkled pile left to make the best leaf mulch your garden has ever been fed. It will keep weeds from sprouting while feeding the soil, and give the garden a finished look.



Now, step back and admire your showcase house and front garden!

they are spotted here again.



### Mosquito Control Matters



It's that time of year again, longer days, warm temperatures and.....mosquitoes! That's right; mosquito season is back and with it comes the risk of West Nile virus. You have the power to stop mosquitoes from being produced in your own yard so they won't spread diseases like West Nile Virus to you, your family and neighbors. Of special concern in our area are the high numbers of foreclosed homes and neglected swimming pools that can become fertile breeding grounds for mosquitoes. One neglected swimming pool can produce thousands of mosquitoes and infect an entire neighborhood putting you at risk.

What should I do if someone I know has a neglected swimming pool? Call the Sacramento-Yolo Mosquito and Vector Control District at 1-800-429-1022 to report the property. You can submit an anonymous report online at www.FIGHTtheBITE.net

#### Mosquito Control Matters! DO YOUR PART!



Help Us Prevent Mosquitoes By Following These Tips:

- At least once a week, walk around your property and check for any containers that may collect water. Empty all buckets, flower pots, children's toys, pet dishes, cans, bird baths, tires or wheel barrows.
- Mosquitoes grow in wet and clogged street gutters. Do not over water your lawn and please utilize yard waste containers for grass clippings and other debris.
- Stock ornamental ponds, fountains and animal water troughs with mosquitofish. The District will provide them for FREE and will even deliver them to your home.
- Drain water from pool, spa and boat covers.
- Keep hot tubs or spas clean or covered.
- Personal protection is important! Always put on an effective mosquito repellent especially around dawn and dusk when mosquitoes are most active.

They spoke about the Foster Care program. Every month hundreds of dogs and cats are euthanized because the shelters are too full to care for all of them. Many of these animals would be or have been wonderful pets, but unfortunately end up in the shelter due to many different situations. Some dogs are just old, like me, and get turned in by their humans because we no longer move very fast (sad because we all get old). Some dogs are injured or sick and just need a place to recover until they are well enough to be adopted. There are also puppies and kittens that need more care in the beginning of their lives, but the shelters don't have the staff to feed and care for these little guys until they get to a certain weight. There are also the dogs that are really scared being in the shelter environment and would do much better living with a human until their forever homes come along. Sometimes just one extra day of life would make a difference in finding a home. This is where the foster program can help. What does this entail? The shelter will supply the animal, the food, medication, vet services and litter. You would supply the love, attention and some light training. This means the world to a shelter animal!!! 
