
A Note from Karla HPNA President


Elections for our new Board of Directors will be held at the Holiday Social December 11th, 2013.


Directors are elected to a two year term and it is their job to oversee all the activities of HPNA.



We have enjoyed a strong start to our school year with the addition of over one hundred new families. With new students comes an influx of traffic congestion in the neighborhood.



Between LDV, Hollywood Park, and St. Roberts, we estimate that 1600 students are beginning school at roughly the same time. Please know that we are working diligently to encourage safe and courteous driving habits and behavior. Our school district just received a safety grant which provides for an additional police officer to patrol our schools, with special emphasis on "hot spots." Our HP community is considered a "hot spot." So, when you see our officer in the neighborhood, please know it is a good thing! She is talking to parents from all three schools, issuing tickets for non-compliance, and reminding families to drive safely and slow down on our narrow streets.

The media put a spotlight on the safety grant on Halloween morning when they held a pseudo-press conference at Hollywood Park Elementary. We received many calls from neighbors regarding the police presence and media coverage. We like the positive coverage and attention!

Questions regarding our marquee...sadly the bid came back too high. The current marquee will stay and in exchange, our green fencing will be completed. The fencing and gates are designed to deter drop-offs on the street and instead direct all traffic to the shared parking lot between HP and LDV to alleviate congestion on the street.

Our Scholastic Book Fair is open to the public after school at 3:00 from 12/9-12/13. Walk on over and look for books and fun stocking stuffer ideas for the young ones.

Please look out for our school during our breaks... School is closed 11/23-12/1 and again 12/21-1/5.

Garden Light

Falling leaves remind us that we must take our gardening activities inside for a few months. Add these items to the "To Do" list. Bring tender or sensitive plants inside to weather the winter and freshen the air. Carefree plants include succulents planted in a bowl as a minicontemplation garden. Use sand and stones to design it. Also, terrarium plants are self-watering and just need occasional misting. Just mix moss, fern and a decorative succulent in a deep glass vase or large decorative jar.

Rake gardens so the small broken shreds of leaves remain to enrich the soil and feed the earthworms. Needles from evergreen trees can be used as mulch without any treatment. If you use leaves to mulch, try running them through the lawn mower to shred them first. It removes sheltering insects and breaks them down for easier decay to enrich the soil.

Look out your windows to imagine your garden view during those rainy or blustery days. Try to make each area a display that will make you smile on dreary days. Now is the time to add bulbs if you have not done so already.
