# **Meet Your Neighbor Coming Home Again**

You can come home again. That's true for this Hollywood Park couple. Alan and Linda Almeida find themselves back home again, as it were, each with diverse paths and experiences along the way.

For Alan, he moved to Hollywood Park as a child in 1967. "I remember great times here growing up. In the late 1960s, 23rd Avenue had many families, all with kids about the same age. This included the Lucich, Gee, Campbell, Moffitt, Robinson, Bertacci, and Plescia families."

"We would play hide and seek all along the block, ride our bikes, and bounce around from home to home playing games, and being active socially. Great memories."

At the age of 17, Alan first became involved with the Music Circus, Sacramento's summer theater tradition of musicals under the blue and green tent downtown. It was here that he first encountered Linda, who worked for Music Circus in 1973 and '74 as a professional dancer in the Ensemble. They would both appear in "Gigi" in 1974. This initial experience eventually led Alan to many summers there, working as the Operations Manager.

# **Sac County Office of Education**

The Sacramento County Office of Education (SCOE) provides leadership, build partnerships, and supports through training and coaching the 13 school districts In our county to improve the quality of education for students. SCOE is a statewide leader in social and emotional learning, English language learner, dyslexia, and early learning support for children. SCOE runs a school of education, coordinates adult education programs, operates Sly Park environmental camp, among many other things.

In 2020, responding to the student mental health crisis, SCOE in partnership with Sacramento County mental health, started to hire and place social workers in schools. SCOE serves 1000 students in our Juvenile Hall and 4 community schools.

SCOE is overseen by a 7-member Board. The Board acts as a judicial body for expulsions, inter-district transfers and charter school appeals. The board hires the Superintendent, approves SCOE budget, sets policies and identified joint priorities with the Superintendent. In 2020, the Board created a scholarship fund and raised \$120,000 in private donations to send our community school students to college

# Have Your Household Junk Picked Up!

Forwarded to you by HPNA\*

Do you know how to dispose of bulky household waste, like old furniture or car tires? City of Sacramento Solid Waste and Recycling residential customers now can make an appointment for a household junk pickup to dispose of items too large to fit in the curbside container.

Residential customers are eligible for two free junk pickups a year, and extra appointments are available for an additional fee. Appointments are available Feb.14 through the end of October.

"Customers can sometimes expect a wait of about two to three weeks, and appointment times can fill up quickly," said Jesa David, media and communications specialist for Recycling and Solid Waste, "we encourage all residents to plan ahead."

To make an appointment, customers can call City Customer Service at 3-1-1 (or 916-264-5011 outside City limits), use the free 311 app, or go online at Sac311.org.

Next came college, then work as a Stage Manager for Royal Viking Line and The Delta Queen Steamboat Company, then for the Walt Disney Company in Anaheim as an Entertainment Manager, and Stage Manager. For the last 20 years, he



has worked in theater operations agement. Family responsibilities finally brought him back to Sacramento and Hollywood Park, where Alan and Linda reside today, in Alan's very same childhood home.

It was 35 years after that Summer of '74 at Music Circus that the two reconnected through the magic of the Internet, with eventually relocating to Sacra-

mento from her native Washington state.

Linda Hoxit-Almeida is originally from the Pacific Northwest, calling Bremerton, and Hood Canal home.



Linda went on to a career in Los Angeles for 10 years, with roles in television shows and movies, her forte being a "triple threat", (dancer, singer, actress). She appeared in television variety shows, including "The Carol Burnett Show", The Sonny and Cher Show", "The Smothers **Brothers** Comedy Hour", and the movies, "Grease", and Mel Brooks' "History of the World Part I".

In 1982, she originated a principle role on Broadway in the musical, "7 Brides for 7 Brothers". You can find videos of many of these performances on YouTube by searching her as "Linda Hoxit".

### News from the volunteers of CommuniTree

Would you like a FREE shade tree in your front yard? You get to pick the tree type, it gets delivered to your house and volunteers plant it for you. Our neighborhood CommuniTree Committee has helped the Sacramento Tree Foundation plant over 130 trees in our neighborhood since 2018. We would love to plant 130 more in the next few years.

If you don't have a tree in your front yard, we are likely to contact you and invite you to get a free tree and participate in our annual volunteer Tree Planting Day on Saturday, October 29th. Friday, September 2nd, is the deadline to sign up for your free tree if you want it planted on our annual Tree Planting Day. Call Sacramento Tree Foundation, 916-924-8733 and tell them you want a tree as part of the Hollywood Park CommuniTree Project. Let us know if you want to volunteer to help plant trees on October 29th.

SMUD and Sacramento Tree Foundation have planted more than 600,000 trees in the Sacramento area since 1990. These trees are helping to cool our homes and streets, beautify our neighborhoods, produce oxygen and store carbon. We all enjoy the benefits of living in this "City of Trees".

Sacramento summers can be brutal on young trees if not cared for properly. Remember to mulch and water your trees to help them to survive. Three to four inches depth of wood chip mulch around young trees conserves moisture and protects the young roots. In general, young trees need water 1-3 times a week to a depth of 6 inches at the drip line, not right next to the trunk. Your older established trees may also need water during our long, dry, hot summers. Watering trees is exempt from drought restrictions. 














# **District 5 Boundary Change and Sum**mer Events

# **Feeling Thirsty?**

Hollywood Park is spoiled by having both a cider taproom (Two Rivers) and brewery (Fountainead) in our backyard. One of the perks of this arrangement is the numerous entertainment and social events both breweries host throughout the year. Both offer taprooms that are all-ages and dog-friendly. Fountainhead is open every night and Two Rivers opens every day but Monday.

**Two Rivers**, who opened its tasting room in July of 2016, has been in business for more than 20 years. The ciders at Two Rivers do not have sugar added in to sweeten them up – they are made so that the fruits are the focus. Other fruits are blended with the apples to create distinct flavors and variety.

The activities at Two Rivers this summer include the following:

- Tuesdays -- Drag Bingo, hosted by Apple Adams.
- Wednesdays -- Trivia (free to play)
- Open mic is a couple times a month on Thurs (free), line dancing class is the last Thursday of each month (free)
- Live music most Fridays and Saturdays
- Once a month it's open on a Monday for Grateful Mondays, where it hosts rotat-



ing Grateful Dead cover bands (June 20th, July 18th, August 15th)

Fountainhead, which is indeed a reference to Ayn Rand, is the result of a friendship and passion for homebrew. Co-owners, Daniel Moffatt and Mark Bojescu, transformed the location, 4621 24th St, from a mechanic shop into into a craft beer hotspot before opening in 2016.
