# **Preparing For A Megaflood**

On August 19th, 2022, The Sacramento Bee released an article entitled "CA is at risk of a megaflood. Are Central Valley communities prepared for it?"

Hang on...did I read that correctly?! A MEGAFLOOD?! What the heck is that?! Apparently, it's "a very severe flood event across a broad region that has the potential to bring catastrophic impacts to society in the areas af-

I did A TON of research (see sources below), and it turns out that California is indeed at risk for a megaflood sometime in the next 40 years. And Sacramento is one of the cities most likely to be impacted. YIKES!!

Reading about the megaflood got me wondering; how CAN we best prepare for an event like this? After reading By Lauren Snead numerous articles and talking with friends and neighbors, here's what I've come up with...

- 1. Have an evacuation plan: If you knew that a megaflood was going to hit within the next 2-3 days, where would you go? Are there flood shelters nearby? How would you get there? Who would you plan to meet up with? What would you bring? Be sure that everyone in your family and/or that lives in your home is aware of the plan.
- 2. Connect with your neighbors: The biggest resource we have is each other! Do you have an elderly neighbor that can't drive? How might you support them in an event like this? Who has a generator? A cabin on higher ground? Gear you could share? Start talking to your neighbors and include them in your plan.
- 3. Create an emergency "to go" bag: This bag should be easy to locate and filled with essentials (first aid, clothes, copies of important documents, batteries, a few days of food, water, whiskey...YES WHISKEY! Ok fine, maybe something with electrolytes like coconut water, and a deck of cards. Essential.) (Continued on Pg. 4)

# **NEIGHBORHOOD NEWS**

(Continued from Pg. 1) 4. Plan for your pets: From dogs to cats to chickens in the backyard and beyond, we love our pets here in Sacramento. So how can we make sure they are taken care of in the event of a flood? Can they come with us if we evacuate? If not, is there a way to elevate and supply them with enough food and water to be OK for a week or more?

- 5. Keep your tank full & car stocked: From the minute the rainy season begins in the Fall until it ends in the Spring, make sure that your car always has at least 1/2 a tank of gas, a few extra gallons of water, healthy(ish) snacks and a change of warm clothes.
- 6. Store sentimental items & important docs up high: Consolidate your sentimental belongings and important documents. Store them high off the ground. That way you can easily grab them when you leave and/or have them high enough that water may not reach them if your house gets flooded.
- 7. Prep your home: a. Clear debris from your roof/ gutters/ land, b. Move or elevate your furniture (at least 4 feet off the ground), c. Turn off your utilities before you leave home
- 8. Turn Around Don't Drown®: Experts advise that you avoid walking or driving through flood waters. Apparently just 6 inches of moving water can knock you down, and 2 feet of water can sweep your vehicle away. Take this seriously.
- 9. Research flood insurance: Does your insurance company carry flood insurance? If so, how much is it? Is it worth the peace of mind to just get the dang flood insurance and be done with it?
- 10.Take the warnings seriously: Most experts agree that we should have a 2-3 day warning before a megaflood hits our area. If the city or state says a megaflood is coming, believe them! Put

your plan into action right away...especially before highways get clogged and driving becomes impossible.

The idea of a megaflood hitting our neighborhood is terrifying, but if we come together as a community to prepare as best we can, perhaps we can minimize the devastating impact of a catastrophe like this. Food for thought!

# The CommuniTree Corner

**Planting Day in Hollywood Park + Carlton Tract**

CommuniTree Committee and Sacramento Tree Foundation hosted our 5th annual Tree Planting Day on Saturday, October 29th. We welcomed 35 eager volunteers to plant 27 new shade trees in our neighborhood. City Councilmember Jay Schenirer, County Supervisor Patrick Kennedy and SMUD Director Dave Tamayo greeted them while we all enjoyed donuts and coffee. After planting the trees, the teams returned to LDV for a pizza lunch. We greatly appreciate the donations of pizza from Jannelle Rattigan and coffee from Starbucks on Sutterville Road.

Since 1990 SMUD and Sacramento Tree Foundation (STF) have worked together to bring over half a million trees to our region. Their long term objective was to create a healthy urban forest which can reduce summer temperatures, improve air quality and enhance quality of life. CommuniTree and STF have planted 174 trees on Planting Days since 2018. Residents also planted an additional 223 free shade trees during the same time period. Great job everyone! Keep on planting. Newly planted trees need to be watered 2-3 times a week totaling 10-15 gallons per week. Drilling a small hole in a five gallon bucket, filling it up with water and allowing the water to drip out works very well. A slow drip from your garden hose for several hours works well also. Spreading wood chip mulch in a 4 foot area around the trunk, 4 inches from the trunk and six inches deep keeps the soil moist longer. We are still in a drought and some of our mature trees died this year due to lack of watering. Deep

# **Sac County Office of Education**



I recently met a mother from Grante Bay whose son Zack, died of a fentanyl overdose. This young man was a star pupil, a successful athlete and had a bright future in front of him. His parents found him dead in his bed and learned that he had taken only one pill of fentanyl thinking it was Percocet. His parents had no clue Zack was buying sleeping pills that were not from a pharmacy. His family is now on a mission to share his story and make sure other young people do not die. They are partnering with the County's "Pills can Kill" initiative. Fentanyl poisoning is the leading cause of death for adults aged 18-45 in the United States, surpassing suicide, gun violence and car accidents. Fentanyl has been found in virtually all street drugs today. Illicit fentanyl is highly addictive and can cause sudden death. Sacramento County Office of Education offers drug and alcohol prevention training, positive alternatives to drug use through Club Live youth programs. Students have created media and marketing materials including billboards, social media, community events to increase awareness of the impacts of drugs and alcohol and reduce/ prevent use. 
